JAC Clubs

Members salute the flag, say the JAC values creed, and participate in community service and patriotic activities, while learning history and developing a deep love of America.

JAC Contests

The JAC Committee sponsors contests in art, creative expression, and community service for preschoolers through grade 12. Any child is eligible to participate in the contest. A child does not have to be a JAC club member or CAR member to enter. (guidelines on the back of this sheet)
